## In order to consider you for admission, we would like to see:

- a full academic CV
- a full transcript of undergraduate and Hons / MRes / MPhil results in Classical Studies, Ancient History, or related disciplines
- a writing sample (e.g. chapter of Hons / MRes / MPhil thesis) of between 5,000–10,000 words
- a 1,000-word research proposal

Once this material has been received, you will be invited to an informal conversation about the application and the Classics programme at ANU with the HDR Convenor, the Head of Discipline and / or the provisional supervisor. This is for you to get more information about the programme and for us to understand better how to help you achieve your research goals.

## **Important Dates**

**International applicants**: the above materials must be received by **July 1** for entry the following year. (University application closing date: August 31)

**Domestic applicants**: the above materials must be received by **August 1** for entry the following year. (University application closing date: October 31)
